Executive Summary: The proposed York County Ambulance Service Franchise Ordinance establishes a formal regulatory and oversight framework for the County's 911 EMS System. The ordinance creates a structured franchise requirement for ambulance providers operating within the County and establishes a collaborative review and operational oversight mechanism to guide system performance, modernization, and expansion. The Justice and Public Safety (JPS) Committee voted 2-0 on February 25, 2026, to refer this ordinance to full County Council for consideration. Meetings have been conducted with leadership from Atrium Health and Piedmont Medical Center to review the ordinance's purpose, operational impact, and implementation framework, and both organizations have expressed support. Adoption of this ordinance will formalize County oversight, enhance accountability, and position York County to strategically manage growth and service quality within the 911 EMS System.
